WHERE IS BLOODVEIN FIRST NATION?

Bloodvein First Nation is located along the eastern shores of Lake Winnipeg, approximately 280 km northeast of Winnipeg. The all season road on the east side of Lake Winnipeg is a 3h 30min drive. Perimeter Airlines also offers flight options.

Princess Harbour is 20 km northwest of Bloodvein First Nation and Little Bullhead is 32 km southwest of the community.

SPECIAL CLASSES OFFERED

Bloodvein River School proudly offers an adult education program. The school also offers a land-based program for students to learn the essentials of what it is like to survive off the land.

EVENTS

Bloodvein First Nation hosts annual cultural day events with numerous activities. Some of these activities include storytelling, geese plucking, fish filleting, and making fried bannock. Everyone is encouraged to be involved with cultural days to make it as enjoyable as possible.

COMPETITIONS

Bloodvein River School actively engages in sport competitions with other communities. Sports are very important for the students, so it is vital that they get as many opportunities as possible to partake in sporting events. The most common sports played are basketball, volleyball, baseball, hockey, and track and field.

STUDENT FACILITIES

Students have access to a gymnasium, weight room, computer lab, home economics room, nursery room, music room, science room, cultural learning room, and a library.

AVERAGE DAY

8:30am

Start the day around 8:30am

8:45am

Meet the students to ensure they go into their required classes.

9:00am

Begin classes to teach the curriculum.

11:45am

Teachers go home or stay at the school for lunch.

4:00pm

The day ends around 4:00pm.

*Up until and including grade 6, each teacher is responsible for teaching multiple subjects

*From grade 7 to grade 10, teachers are responsible for teaching one subject (on a five block system)

WHAT IS BLOODVEIN RIVER SCHOOL LOOKING FOR IN A TEACHER?

Bloodvein River School is looking for experienced teachers who are committed to educating First Nations students.

Teachers are encouraged to implement their personal teaching strategies into the existing school curriculum to provide the students with a personal teaching method. Teachers are encouraged to use and teach in the Ojibway language.

OTHER RESPONSIBILITIES

Other responsibilities include recess duty, supervision before school and after school and during lunch. Teachers are also encouraged to volunteer and assist in extracurricular activities. Teachers are encouraged to act as role models for the students and demonstrate leadership skills.

TEACHERAGE RENTALS

The school provides accommodations for teachers.

AMENITIES

Teachers can live in a one- or twobedroom house with a washer and dryer, bathroom, furniture, kitchen, heating, hot water, stove, oven, and refrigerator. Tenants are responsible for bringing their personal belongings such as televisions, microwaves, kitchen utensils, toiletries, and bedding.

WIFI/CELLUAR SERVICE

There is Wi-Fi and cellular service in the school and within the community.

HIGHLIGHTS

Bloodvein First Nation is a community with amazing landscapes and is well regarded for its canoe routes. Residents fish and hunt on a regular basis.

COMMUNITY LIFE

Residents of the community are very welcoming and enjoy interacting with everyone that lives there. Both students and parents are heavily involved in sports. Everyone is encouraged to get involved with community activities.

Bloodvein has been named by the UNESCO World Heritage Committee as a World Heritage Site in Canada. It is part of Pimachiowin Aki, which means 'the land that gives life' in Anishinaabemowin. The Bloodvein River System is a popular, intermediate canoeing excursion. The gymnasium is another popular location where many residents spend a lot of their time. Many sports and events take place in the gym, so there is always a new reason to check it out.

SERVICES

Bloodvein First Nation has services such as general stores, a health centre, an airport, a repair garage, a gas station, an RCMP detachment, and a brand new water treatment plant.
