WHERE IS BUNIBONIBEE?


Formerly known as Oxford House First Nation, Bunibonibee is located near Oxford Lake and one of Canada's Heritage Rivers, Hayes River.

Geographically, the community is approximately 190km from the city of Thompson, 400km from The Pas, and 600km northeast of Winnipeg.

SERVICE CENTRES & AMMENITIES

Bunibonibee possesses many services and amenities to provide incoming teachers with a comfortable stay, including a Tim Hortons, grocery and essential goods stores, fresh produce, a sporting arena, outdoor hockey rinks, North Star Resort on Knee Lake, and much more.

Bunibonibee is also known for its great outdoor adventures, including hiking, trekking, sightseeing, animal watching, hunting, and capturing photogenic views.

SCHOOL SPECIALTY AREAS

SPECIAL CLASSES OFFERED

Bunibonibee's schools offer a variety of specialty classes, including land-based and cultural learning, survival skills, woodworking, hunting, fishing, medicines, outdoor cooking, and industrial arts. By combining traditional-based education with contemporary reading and writing, each student will be well equipped to succeed in today's economy while retaining their cultural identities.

EVENTS

Bunibonibee's schools host many communal and cultural events to keep kids on the right path while bringing the community together. During the winter months, members of the community enjoy getting together at the winter carnival, for ice fishing, or to compete in hockey tournaments. During the warmer months, residents can enjoy festivals, carnivals, canoeing, boating trips, and summer fishing derbies.

COMPETITIONS

The community gets its students to compete in various sporting events, such as beach volleyball, indoor volleyball, basketball, and more. Bunibonibee also has an ice rink for outdoor hockey games and tournaments.

FACILITIES

STUDENT FACILITIES

Bunibonibee's schools have several classrooms, a library, computer lab, science lab, cooking room, and industrial arts room. The new and upgraded schools, respectively, now host larger and modern teaching spaces with upgraded specialty classrooms and equipment for both students and teachers.

TEACHER FACILITIES

Teachers have a staff lounge, where they can relax and socialize with other teachers. They also have access to all the student facilities.

RENOVATIONS & SERVICES

In September 2021, Bunibonibee unveiled the grand opening of their brand-new state-of-the-art high school while also undergoing renovations for their elementary school. Both schools now host additional classrooms, upgraded playgrounds, and new equipment and facilities for students and staff to enjoy.

WI-FI/CELLULAR SERVICE

The students and staff have free access to Wi-Fi at the school and the community also has 3G cellular service available for use.

TEACHER RESPONSIBILITIES

AVERAGE DAY

8:30 AM

Meet the students and start the day.

8:55 AM

Morning announcements and prayers. Teaching begins.

10:30 AM

Short recess in the morning.

12:00 PM

Lunch break.

2:00 PM

Afternoon recess.

3:40 PM

End of school day.

All teachers are responsible for teaching multiple subjects

WHAT IS BUNIBONIBEE LOOKING FOR IN A TEACHER?

Interested teachers must be eligible to teach in Manitoba and have obtained Manitoban certification so the students can be accredited. Beyond that, we hope our teachers are passionate, friendly, outgoing, respectful of Indigenous culture, and willing to participate in community events with students, residents, and Elders.

OTHER RESPONSIBILITIES

Teachers are expected to take part in extracurricular activities and help tutor students if needed. Volunteering is always welcomed to help develop stronger relationships with the residents.

"We look for people who are willing to make good relationships with the community and with the students, are creative, and who can teach different methods and different styles."



TEACHER ACCOMMODATIONS

TEACHERAGE RENTALS

Bunibonibee has built over one dozen new teacherages and has made them available for rent. They are regularly maintained and their monthly cost is subsidized for teachers.

AMENITIES

Teachers have access to a washer, dryer, bathroom, kitchen, heating, hot water, stove, oven, refrigerator, television, microwave, bed, and couches. Teachers are responsible for bringing their own kitchen utensils, toiletries, and bedsheets.

WI-FI/CELLULAR SERVICE

The community has 3G cellular service and the teacherages have access to Wi-Fi.

RENT

Rent is subsidized and is approximately \$260/month for a two-bedroom teacherage.

COMMUNITY LIFE

HIGHLIGHTS

Dating back to 1798 as Hudson's Bay Trading Post, Bunibonibee Cree Nation is now a peaceful and friendly community with over 2,500 community members. Bunibonibee's lakes and rivers, boating trips, and picturesque waterfalls make the community the perfect home for nature lovers.

During the summer, residents enjoy local festivals, hunting days, sporting events, and much more. In addition, residents enjoy welcoming new teachers to their community by inviting them to partake in traditional events. This may include Treaty Day celebrations, fishing derbies, traditional cooking classes, and being part of sweat lodges and sage burning ceremonies. In the winter, community members can enjoy ice fishing, outdoor hockey tournaments, snowshoeing, hikes, and winter carnivals.

With plenty of nature to explore and sights to see, Bunibonibee is a beautiful place that many people are proud to call home.

COMMUNITY LIFE

Bunibonibee is a peaceful and calm community with beautiful sights and plenty of outdoor activities to enjoy year-round. Community residents are very friendly, welcoming, and always encourage incoming teachers to get involved within their culture and traditions. Between cultural days, festivals, and fishing derbies, this is an excellent community to live and teach in.

When venturing outside of Bunibonibee, residents may visit the community of God's Lake, Haze River, Laidlaw River, and even the beautiful Choke Falls.

"You have a lot of hiking, sightseeing areas, and historic paintings. We have the Haze Rive, the Laidlaw River, and the Choke Falls as well. If you get to know our people, they'll show you what makes the community beautiful."

SERVICES

Bunibonibee has a Tim Hortons, a resort, grocery and retail stores, a church, high-speed internet, a post office, an airport, Triple B Motel, RCMP, and medical responders. The new school also has a full workout facility and a modern gymnasium with new equipment.
